## North Indians face most extreme air pollution in world: EPIC study

**New Delhi, Sept 1:** A study by the Energy Policy Institute at the University of Chicago (EPIC) has found that 480 million people in northern India face the "most extreme levels of air pollution in the world."

This air pollution has spread over decades beyond the region to western and central Indian states such as Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh, where the average person is now losing between two-and-a-half to three years of life expectancy as compared to early 2000, the study said.

Indian cities routinely dominate global pollution rankings and bad air kills more than a million people every year, the BBC reported. The report by EPIC said that north India breathes "pollution levels that are 10 times worse than those found anywhere else in the world".

## Out of total 65 cr vax doses, Covishield's share is 57 crore

## NO TAKERS FOR SPUTNIK V; COVAXIN IN SHORT SUPPLY

India administered 65.40 crore doses of Covid-19 vaccines until August 31 midnight, a record of sorts in less than eight months. But India's entire burden of Covid immunisation programme has fallen upon Covishield as it clocked more than 57 crore doses out of 65.40 crore.

The official data showed that despite tall claims made by the Bharat Biotech that it will supply Covaxin from two crore a month to five crore by May-June, remained a pipedream only. The Covaxin's doses administered so far were 7.85 crore only.

Shockingly, the Russian Sputnik V vaccine which was introduced with great fanfare two months ago, failed to attract people to take the shots. Of the 7.49 lakh doses utilised so far, majority of them have been administered in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.

Maharashtra accounted for less than a lakh doses. Sputnik V has been inoculated by private hospitals and institutes only.

The lukewarm response of the people towards the Russian vaccine is for a variety of issues; logistics as well as price. Dr Reddy's Laboratories is the official canalisation agency for the Sputnik V in India after the programme was launched on

May 22. Government sources concede that had the Serum Institute of India (SII), Pune not taken the lead in the midst of the pandemic last year and invested heavily in bringing the Covishield by teaming with Oxford University and AstraZeneca, India's vaccination programme would not have succeeded the way it has now.

The SII is set to supply 20 crore doses to the Central government and is also working on a new vaccine COVACOX. The SII has supplied 60 crore doses during the past eight months to the government which is a record.

## Fake vaccine: ED raids 10 locations across Kolkata

**Kolkata, Sept 1:** The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Wednesday conducted raids at 10 locations across Kolkata in connection with the fake vaccine case.

Though the ED officials didn't divulge the details of the raids, they were conducted following the arrest of Debanjan Deb, who impersonated as an IAS officer and conducted fake vaccination camps.

According to sources in the ED office, the officials raided the houses of Deb and some of his aides, who have also been arrested by the Kolkata Police in connection with the fake vaccination racket.

According to official sources, the objective of the raids was to understand the nature of the transactions carried out while conducting the fake vaccination camps. The case has also taken into account the money laundering angle, which is being investigated.

On June 23, Deb was arrested by the city police for allegedly posing as an IAS officer and organised a Covid-19 vaccination camp.

## AIIMS (Delhi) staff strike from October 25

**New Delhi, Sept 1:** All the three recognised unions of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Delhi, on Wednesday announced that they will go on an indefinite strike from October 25.

Presidents of all three Unions - ANU's Harish Kajla, KU's Satyaprakash Kalra, and OA's Ajit Singh - submitted a joint memorandum to the AIIMS Director informing about the indefinite strike to be commenced from October 25.

## Separatist leader Geelani no more

**Srinagar, Sept 1:** Syed Ali Shah Geelani, avowedly a pro-Pakistan supporter who spearheaded the separatist movement in Jammu and Kashmir for over three decades, died at his residence here on Wednesday night, officials said.

Geelani, 91, is survived by two sons and six daughters. He remarried after his first wife passed away in 1968.

The separatist leader had been suffering from a kidney disease for over two decades, besides having other age-related issues, including dementia.

Mobile internet was being shut down in Kashmir Valley as a precautionary measure to prevent confusion due to spread of rumours. According to one

of his family members, Geelani breathed his last at 10.30 pm. A three-time MLA in the erstwhile state

from Sopore, Geelani had virtually become the face of agitation in the 2008 Amarnath land row, 2010 agitation sparked by killing of a youth in Srinagar.

He was the founder member of Hurriyat Conference but broke away and formed his own Tehreek-e-Hurriyat in early 2000. He finally bid farewell to his own Hurriyat Conference in June 2020.

Pakistani Prime Minister Imran Khan expressed con-

dolences over Geelani's death on his official Twitter handle.

Former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister Mehbooba Mufti tweeted saying that she was saddened by the news of his death. "We may not have agreed on most things but I respect him for his steadfastness and standing by his belief..."

People's Conference (PC) chairman Sajad Lone said, "Heartfelt condolences to the family of Syed Ali Shah Geelani Sahib. Was an esteemed colleague of my late father. May Allah grant him Jannat." Geelani would be buried at the place of his choice in the neighbourhood of Hyderpora in the outskirts of the city.
