While Hussain was India's big winner with three Grammys, Rakesh Chaurasia picked up two. Singer Shankar Mahadevan, violinist Ganesh Rajagopalan and percussionist Selvaganesh Vinayakram, Hussain's collaborators in the fusion group Shakti, won one Grammy each at the event held at the Crypto.com Arena. Shakti won the 2024 Grammy Award for best global music album for "This Moment". Hussain won two other awards -- the best global music performance for "Pashto" and best contemporary instrumental album for "As We Speak".

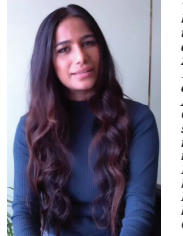

Hutterfly incidentally, is a lifestyle and entertainment portal targeting millennial women. Explaining the dramatic announcement that many saw as a cheap PR stunt, the statement issued by Pandey's agency noted:



"Our actions were driven by a singular mission -- to elevate awareness about Cervical Cancer. In 2022, India registered 123,907 Cervical Cancer deaths. After Breast Cancer, Cervical Cancer is the second-most frequent malignancy affecting middle-aged women in India. Many of you may be unaware but Poonam's own mother has bravely battled Cancer."

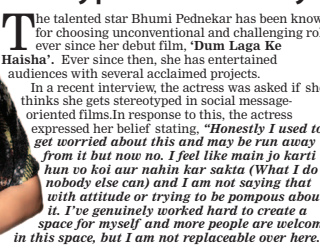
